





Pennsylvania Nitrogen Loads: 1985-2015




Percent of Nitrogen Goal Achieved






Pennsylvania Nitrogen Loads: 2015-2025

Phase 3 WIP


EPA Expectations final June 2017

Must demonstrate "reasonable assurance."







Funding

Need for Bay: \$378.3 M annually

Have: \$127M annually statewide







Funding Matters

MARYLAND

Bay Restoration Fund

- \$139 M FY15
- Sewer bill surcharge
- WWTPs, septic, ag

Bay 2010 Trust Fund

- \$39 M FY16
- Portion of rental car and fuel taxes
- Non-point source, incl. ag

VIRGINIA

Water Quality Improvement Fund

- \$59 M FY17
- 10% of GF surplus
- WWTP and NRCF

Natural Resource Commitment Fund

- \$62 M FY17
- WQIF, real estate recordation fee
- Technical assistance and cost-share

Complementary Legislation

TITLE 3

- 1. Establish an "Agricultural Certainty" program.
- 2. Amend Clean & Green to require compliance with manure management plan/nutrient management plan and ag E&S plan as a condition of eligibility. (HB 1447)
- 3. Create a certification program for commercial **fertilizer** applicators and limit the nitrogen and phosphorus in fertilizer applied to turf. (SB 563)

TITLE 35

1. Repeal or significantly modify the Clean Streams Law prohibition of **stream fencing** requirements (1937, June 22, P.L. 1987, § 702, added 1980, Oct. 16, P.L. 985, No. 169, § 1).
